Progress Update

New facilities is as follows:

- 1) Our six-room school is now completed, with 252 students. Interior furniture and equipment is badly needed. English courses are offered to all students.
- 2) Our newly built storage room is now completed with a two car garage.
- 3) We have completed building three new houses for the poor. More houses are planed for the near future, depending on much needed funding.

Medical Mission Trip May 2004

Accomplishments:

Within the first three days our medical crew organized a field and local clinic and in the process, treated more than 600 people.

Approximately 200 lb of various medication and natural remedies were distributed to the patients.

Illness ranged from minor to major, most were serious and required immediate treatment. It was determined that at least 5 lives were saved from death due to illness or other malady.

One of the orphan children, Romil is now in Maine and is doing well after his eye surgery. Had it not been for his treatment, he certainly would have faced blindness. We must praise God for this miracle that saved this boys vision.

It has been a while since our last Newsletter, and many trips to the orphanage in Haiti. Forgive us the delay due to the chaos of Haiti with their last revolution. We keep struggling against the odds in our often inadequate efforts to save and protect what God has thrust upon us.

Projects with funding needs:

We still need to build a road to give us access to the beach from the main road.

We also need to clean up a large portion of it for farming and vegetables gardening .Our progress has been limited due to all the constant misfortune that we had to go through, this last few months.

The very needed guest house for missionaries and visitors is still our Priority, in order to minimize our expenses each trip, and also to be right there on the site.
